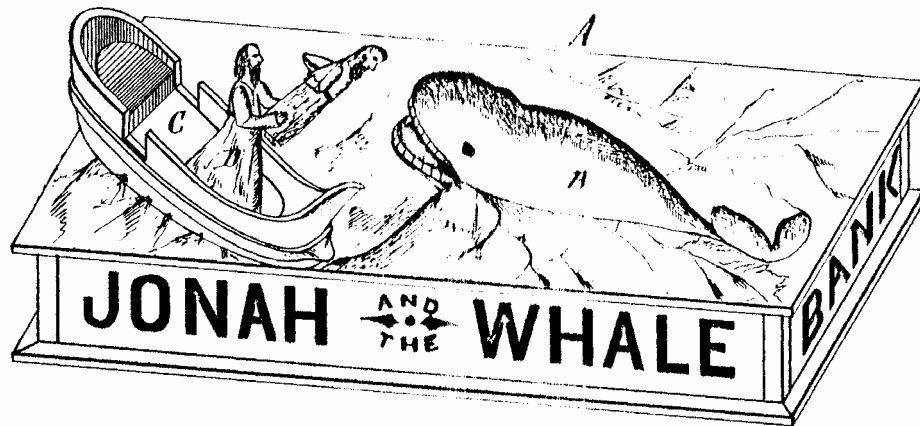

DESIGN FOR A TOY SAVINGS-BANK.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 20,007, dated July 15, 1890.

Application filed June 16, 1890. Serial No. 355,654. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, PETER ADAMS, a citizen of the United States, residing at the city of Buffalo, in the county of Erie and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Toy Savings-Banks, of which the following is a specification.

This design relates to the general form or configuration of an ornamental toy savings-bank; and it consists of a frame or base and the representation of a body of water, with the figure of a whale and a boat containing a human figure, the whole being designed to represent the parable of "Jonah and the Whale."

My novel design is clearly illustrated in the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification, in which A represents the frame or base, the upper surface of which is undulated in imitation of waves. Upon this base

is the figure B of a whale, and in front of the whale is a miniature boat C, containing a human figure D, standing in the boat facing the whale and represented as holding out a human figure.

I claim—

The design for a toy savings-bank herein described and shown, consisting of a base, the figure of a whale resting on the base, and a miniature boat resting on the base in front of the whale and containing a human figure, as set forth.
